Whilst the lake has a healthy population of trout cod, they are purely catch and release only and as such will not be a target species. Mandatory labelling of seafood

Country of origin labelling (CoOL) will soon be mandatory in Australia to give consumers in hospitality settings clear, consistent information about where their seafood comes from.

Australia's federal, state and territory consumer ministers met in November to plan CoOL and voted to introduce the 'AIM' model. Under this model, hospitality businesses will need to show if seafood is either:

- Australian (A)
- imported (I)
- mixed origin (M), if a dish includes both Australian and imported seafood.

Businesses don't need to do anything yet - a transition period will give them time to adjust with more details about the changes coming this year.

These changes will not affect retailers, such as supermarkets - CoOL requirements already apply in retail settings.

The decision comes after \$1.6 million was allocated in the 2022 federal budget to expand the use of country of origin labelling, previously only required by supermarkets and retail businesses.
